

Unemployment in the EU27 regions in 2012

## **Regional unemployment rates ranged from 2.5% in Salzburg and Tirol to 38.5% in Ceuta and 34.6% in Andalucía**

Regional unemployment rates<sup>1</sup> varied widely across the 270 NUTS 2 regions<sup>2</sup> of the **EU27** in 2012, with the lowest rates recorded in the regions of **Salzburg** and **Tirol** (both 2.5%) in Austria and **Tübingen**, **Oberbayern** and **Trier** (all 2.7%) in Germany, while the highest rates were registered in the regions of **Ceuta** (38.5%), **Andalucía** (34.6%), **Extremadura** and **Canarias** (both 33.0%) in Spain and **Dytiki Makedonia** (29.9%) in Greece.

Among the regions, 53 had an unemployment rate of less than 5.2% in 2012, half the average for the **EU27**. They included twenty-two regions in **Germany**, eight out of nine regions in **Austria**, seven regions in the **Netherlands**, five in the **United Kingdom**, four in **Belgium**, three in **Romania**, two in the **Czech Republic**, one in **Italy** and the **Grand Duchy of Luxembourg**. At the other extreme, 25 regions had a rate higher than 20.8%, double that of the **EU27**: eleven regions in **Spain**, ten regions in **Greece** and four **French Overseas Departments**<sup>3</sup>.

These data<sup>4</sup> on regional unemployment, compiled on the basis of the EU Labour Force Survey, are published by **Eurostat, the statistical office of the European Union**.

### **Female unemployment rates varied from 2.7% in Freiburg to 49.4% in Ceuta and 36.8% in Dytiki Makedonia**

In the **EU27** in 2012 the female unemployment rate was slightly higher than the male rate (10.5% compared with 10.4%). In 2012, the female unemployment rate varied between 2.7% in **Freiburg** in Germany and 49.4% in **Ceuta** in Spain and 36.8% in **Dytiki Makedonia** in Greece, while the male rate ranged from 2.3% in **Salzburg** and **Tirol** in Austria to 33.6% in **Andalucía** in Spain.

### **Unemployment rates for young people varied from 4.2% in Oberbayern to 72.5% in Dytiki Makedonia**

In 2012, the average unemployment rate for young people aged between 15 and 24 in the **EU27** was 22.9%. Regional differences in the unemployment rate for young people are however very marked. In the **EU27** in 2012, the lowest rates for young people were recorded in the German regions of **Oberbayern** (4.2%), **Tübingen** (4.5%) and **Freiburg** (4.8%), and the highest in **Dytiki Makedonia** (72.5%) in Greece, **Ceuta** (70.6%) and **Canarias** (62.6%) in Spain. In almost three quarters of the **EU27** regions, the unemployment rate for young people was at least twice that for total unemployment.

### **In almost one fifth of the regions, more than half of the unemployed had been out of work for at least a year**

The long-term unemployment share, which is defined as the percentage of unemployed persons who have been unemployed for 12 months or more, stood at 44.6% on average in the **EU27** in 2012, and varied significantly across the regions. In the **EU27** in 2012, the lowest shares of long-term unemployed were recorded in **Mellersta Norrland** (15.4%), **Stockholm** (16.3%) and **Västsverige** (17.5%) in Sweden and **Bucureşti-Ilfov** (17.7%) in Romania, and the highest in the French Overseas Departments of **Guadeloupe** (80.3%), **Guyane** (74.7%) and **Martinique** (72.9%) and **Východné Slovensko** (71.1%) in Slovakia. In 53 regions more than half of the unemployed had been out of work for at least 12 months.

1. The unemployment rate is defined as the percentage of unemployed persons aged 15-74 in the economically active population. According to the recommendations of the International Labour Organisation, a person is deemed to be unemployed if all three of the following conditions are met:
  - he or she is without work during the survey reference week;
  - he or she is available for work, being able to take up employment within two weeks;
  - he or she has actively sought work over the past four weeks.
2. These data are based on the Nomenclature of Territorial Units for Statistics (NUTS) as modified in January 2011. NUTS 2010 provides a uniform, consistent breakdown of territorial units for the production of regional statistics for the EU. Level 2 of the nomenclature has 270 regions: Belgium (11), Bulgaria (6), the Czech Republic (8), Denmark (5), Germany (38), Ireland (2), Greece (13), Spain (19), France (26), Italy (21), Hungary (7), the Netherlands (12), Austria (9), Poland (16), Portugal (7), Romania (8), Slovenia (2), Slovakia (4), Finland (5), Sweden (8) and the United Kingdom (37). Estonia, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg and Malta are all considered as single regions at NUTS 2 level. The statistical regions in the candidate and EFTA countries follow the principles of the NUTS classification; however there is no legal base. There are 46 regions in these countries at Level 2: Norway (7), Switzerland (7), Croatia (2) and Turkey (26). Iceland, Liechtenstein, Montenegro and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia are all considered as single regions at Level 2.
3. Data for French Overseas Departments (Guadeloupe, Martinique, Guyane and Réunion) refer to the second quarter of 2012.
